# SCWI UPDATES: PROVINCIAL CHAIRS MEETING NOVEMBER 1 2017

### 1. May 15'th Symposium

- Theme is "Celebrating Wellness/Well-Being"
- Keynote speaker will be a doctor from McMaster U who speaks about mental health
- Advise SCWI if we have completed any kind of dual credit research project
- Each RPT to submit 3 ideas to Larry/Janette by November 27 2017
- One idea could include the college's pathways documents

### 2. Student Mental Health and Learning Resources

- A mental health ASSIST initiative is available to Boards provincially (see link on SCWI website)
- The RFP for 2017-2018 will allow us to apply for a mental health forum (or activity)
- The after SWAC and after ADC counsellors would benefit from mental health strategies
- One RPT has discussed the feasibility of hiring a CYC or SW to be present on-site for the SWAC students. No RPT has officially done this but have considered it. One idea is to use the (combined?) funding for the after SWAC counsellor to hire a social worker to be on-site to do this.
- Boards and colleges both have personnel that can and should be accessed for student support
- There is a mental health resource document section on the SCWI website. RPTs are welcome to add to this via Bill Jack (also on the French language site)

### 3. Transportation

- SCWI will approve 2017-2018 transportation to the amount that was claimed in 2016-2017
- 91% of the approved transportation budget was spent provincially...5% better than last year. (That translates to half a million to a million dollars making it difficult to approach the funders for additional funding.)
- 40% of dual credit underspending is in transportation
- Unused transportation can be used to fund dual credit seats through a contract change
- EDCS contains transportation extracts that can assist in identifying transportation costs (extract 508)
- Predict what your semester 2 transportation costs will be and make contract changes based on students numbers (the 10 day count)
- Must get the bus companies to invoice in good time
- Each school board in the province belongs to a transportation consortium; use this to find out better or best rates
- The transportation consortium in Niagara, for example, now has one person who arranges all dual credit transportation for all school boards
- The lowest bid may not always be the best...be attentive to safety and service (especially for taxis)
- Some boards mandate that a supervisor be on the bus in the event teens get out of control while on the highway
- Some boards have rules that student passengers may not sit in the front seat of a taxi

### 4. SWAC/ADC vouchers

- Vouchers will be sent to the RPT chair who will then distribute to the colleges

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- Two types of vouchers will be included: for ADC and for SWAC students
- The vouchers will be designated by college based on the number of EDCS approved seats in SWAC and ADC
- Basically, each RPT will receive a list of numbers divided by college and by ADC or SWAC
- Students MUST be enrolled in ADC or SWAC
- Vouchers will be issued October 24, February 12 and July 9 and will have expiry dates
- If a college has already paid for some OCAS application fees, the colleges can invoice David Armstrong for reimbursement.
- University applications are also covered. Colleges will need to get reimbursement from SCWI.
- It is expected that the student and college advisor will work together on the college application. The voucher should not be handed to the student. This is the job of the college advisor.
- Step-by-step instructions and screen prints of the OCAS application are included in the webinar posted on SCWI

#### 5. On-line student registration

- Very good program
- Colleges need to get on board to customized the registration site
- Another year of pilot is recommended with perhaps a couple more colleges participating.
- Cost? Not stated
- OCAS is interested in this pilot as it could tie into research

#### 6. SCWI Newsletters

- Only available on-line
- Now up to 70 pages in length
- Colleges and boards are encouraged to take pictures and write up articles during the course of the dual credits so they are available for submission when requested

#### 7. Provincial Data

- Almost 27,000 students in the province enrolled in dual credits
  - Provincially: Retention Rate: 88% Success Rate: 91% Target Group: 79% in the Primary Target Group 18% in SHSM 9% in OYAP

Provincial Footprint: 4.2% SWAC Success: 88% OYAP Level 1 Success: 79% OSSD: 56.5% of dual credit students earned their diploma

- 117 forums and activities with 38,800 participants

#### 8. Financials

- Approximately 1.3 million dollars was left unspent (the bulk in transportation)
- Can NOT overspend (repeated a few times)

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- Let SCWI know asap if programs are not running
- About 1600 buys a dual credit seat
